

The Aboriginal Business Administration Certificate (ABAC) is designed to provide pathway programming for those Aboriginal students who do not meet the criteria for direct admission or transfer admission to the undergraduate program and for Aboriginal students who wish to obtain a certificate in business but do not want to study the four year degree program.

## Quick Facts

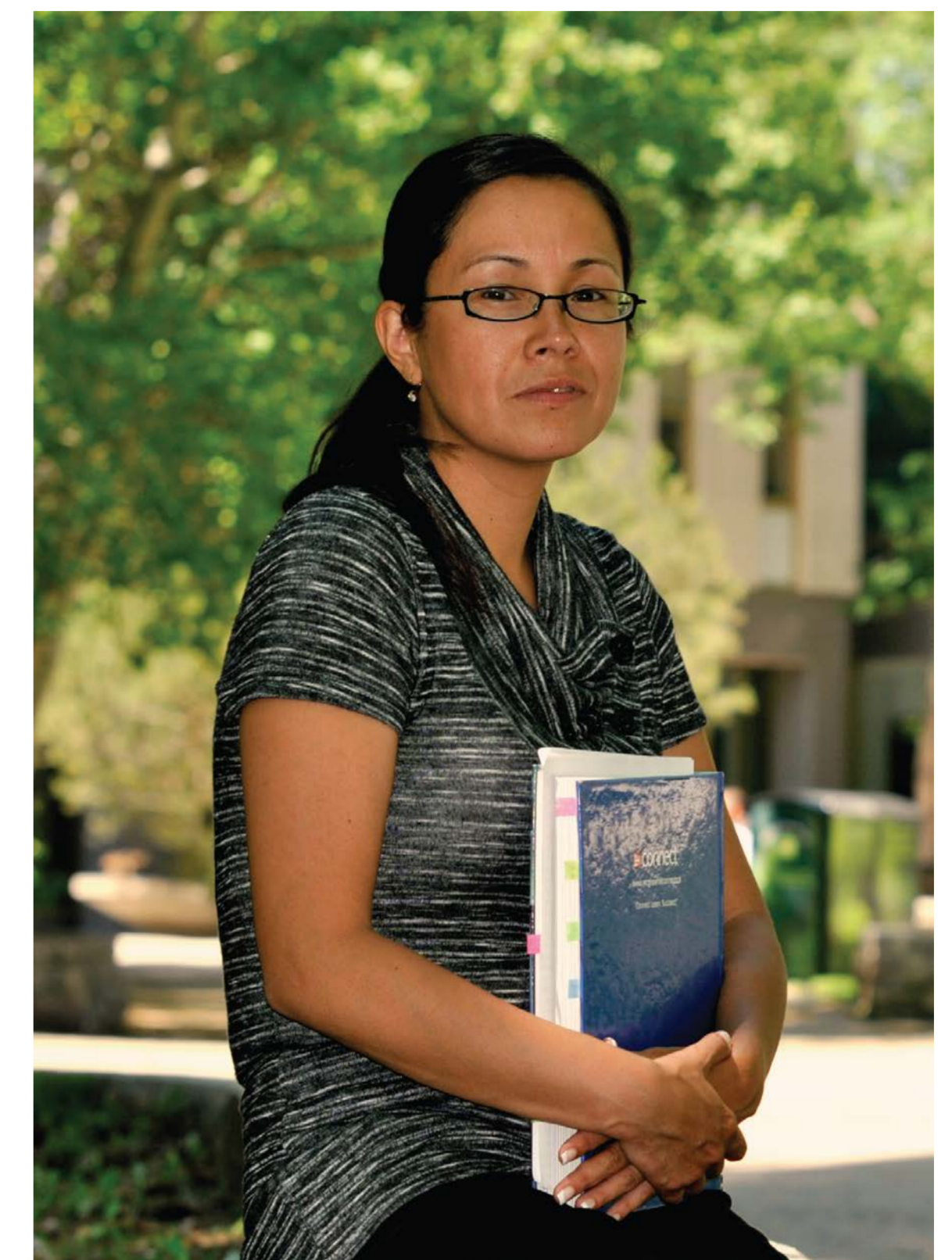
- Only 2 years to complete the certificate (based on 24 credits per year)
- Flexible admission standards

- Accessible tutoring for specified courses
- Math bridging programming available for students who need to upgrade their high school mathematics
- All courses transfer to the Bachelor of Commerce degree program providing students with the opportunity to pursue further education
- Students receive a certificate of proficiency upon successful completion of the program
